

16 to 19 tuition fund review 2020-21

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is a £96 million one-off fund for the 2020 to 2021 academic year only. It is ring fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 providers to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted. For the academic year 2020-21, we have been allocated a one-off grant of £1,811.

Barriers to attainment:		
A	GCSE maths. Achieving a grade 4 or above in GCSE maths is paramount to improving students' pathway opportunities. A small group of students did not achieve a grade 4 in their maths GCSE in 2020 due to the disruptions caused by the Covid-19 outbreak.	
B	Achieving a grade 4 or above in GCSE English is paramount to improving students' pathway opportunities. A small group of students did not achieve a grade 4 in their English GCSE in 2020 due to the disruptions caused by the Covid-19 outbreak.
