Government guidance states for schools states:

“The safety of children and staff is our utmost priority.”

“The advice seeks to support staff working in schools, colleges and childcare settings, to deliver this approach in the safest way possible, focussing on measures they can put in place to help limit the risk of the virus spreading within education and childcare settings.”

“In education, childcare and social care settings, preventing the spread of the coronavirus involves dealing with direct transmissions (for instance, when in close contact with those sneezing and coughing) and indirect transmission (via touching contaminated surfaces.) A range of approaches and actions should be employed to do this.”

Government guidance for parents concerning re-opening of schools states:

“We have provided guidance and support to schools, colleges and child care settings on implementing protective measures in education and childcare settings to help them reduce the risk of transmission as more children and young people return.”

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Year group bubbles: All children are in whole year group bubbles (Y12/13 together as sixth form) Zoning: Children will stay in the same zones and do not mix with any other year groups. Where specialist rooms are used a careful timetable is planned to ensure that there is no mixing of year group bubbles. Enhanced cleaning has been introduced in specialist rooms Seating: All seating will be facing forward to reduce transmission, in line with government guidance Teacher location: Will be at least 2m from any children. Teacher will remain at position and not circulate within the room. Any support staff will also observe 2m social distancing at all times Lesson planning: Lessons will be planned for individual work (not pairings or group work). Feedback and instruction will use the large whiteboard - no close interaction Furniture: Any excess furniture in all classrooms will be removed to increase space Ventilation: Classrooms will be well ventilated, with all doors propped open and windows open, providing the greatest opportunity for constant renewal of the air Warm clothing: Children will be advised to wear extra layers under their white school shirt and will be permitted to wear coats when the weather turns very cold Children work stations: Children, as far as possible, will have their own “work station” and will keep to their desks at all times when in the room. Central seating plans have been introduced as much as possible. Social distancing: Instructions will be given and revisited throughout the day, (the use of toilet, movement around the school etc) Praise will be given for adherence and sanctions given for non-compliance Clear behaviour expectations will be detailed in a letter to parent, explaining that any non-compliance will mean the child will have to return to home learning. The Parent Form will confirm parents’ understanding of our expectations and their responsibility to insist on compliance from their child Bags, coats and lunchboxes: These will be kept with the child, there will be no sharing or touching

1. Toilets: There are designated toilets for each “year group” and staff will only allow one boy and one girl from their class to go to the toilet at a time, to minimise numbers meeting at the same time in the facilities. Staff will allow a continuous flow of children to use toilet facilities to support the minimising of any numbers at any time. Toilets have automatic driers
2. Toilet entrance doors where possible will be propped open to prevent the necessity to touch the doors
3. Hand Washing: Staff to remind the children that they will need to wash their hands and will confirm that they have done so on their return to the classroom
4. Hand sanitisers: Personal hand sanitisers will be used by each child on their return to their classroom after using the toilets
5. Signs: Extra signs will be placed in toilet areas, regarding the washing of hands
6. Soap: Extra soap will be ordered to ensure we do not run out
7. Hand sanitiser will be available in all classrooms and Hand sanitising will be an integral part of the routine into and out of classrooms
8. All toilet facilities have hand driers and these are checked on a regular basis

1. On journey to/from school: We know that the children are unlikely to be socially distancing on their way to/from school, but we will, nevertheless, be constantly reminding them of the importance of social distancing
2. Entrances/exits: We have allocated different colour coded entrances/exits for each year group as they arrive/exit the school, so these are not shared and are clearly identified with signage. Entrances/exits are sufficiently apart from each other to avoid too much congestion. Signage for parents and children will be displayed outside the entrances/exits
3. Staggering of entrance and exits of the students to ensure that year group bubbles are kept apart at the beginning and end of the day
4. Drop off/collection: Instructions will be clearly outlined in letter regarding social distancing between families in the morning drop off/afternoon collection with parents and the children themselves. Parents will be asked not to drop/collect unless absolutely necessary.
5. Supervision: SLT and senior middle leaders will be on duty to supervise entry and exit each day. Children being dismissed from their class during the day and from school at the end of the day, have supervision to keep them with their specified year group
6. Zoning: The route to each zone will be clearly indicated by coloured paint matching the zone colour, there will be no crossing of pathways, to minimise any contact between year groups
7. Staff collect children from zones to take to lessons to reduce congestion at any time. Students line up against their class codes to keep classes apart as far as possible even within year groupings
8. Prevention: We have made it very clear any unwell children should not be in. Staff closely look for any signs
9. Fire doors: As a managed risk, we are wedging open some fire doors to avoid students and staff having to use hands to handles and push plates. In the event of a fire, during an evacuation, doors will be manually closed, to

stop the spread of the fire. Each evening all fire doors are closed and each morning open again by the Premises team. Risk level to fire spread is deemed as low

1. Zoning: There is an allocated break/lunch area/zone for each year group. There will be no contact with any other year groups
2. The children are encouraged to go outdoors and get some fresh air
3. Students can be inside at break and lunch but they must stay in their seating positions from Period 2 (last lesson before break) or from Period 4 (last lesson before lunch)
4. Supervision: Staff supervision throughout the day, will actively encourage social distancing Y
5. Social distancing: Will be modelled by all staff
6. Sixth Form swipe cards now enable students to utilise home facilities rather than sharing private study facilities in school
7. Students in the Sixth Form common room/private study areas will be wearing face coverings

Timetabling: The timetable has been rewritten to use double lessons to radically reduce movement Y 3. Sixth Form: Sixth Form is operating on an extended day structure to ease pressure on entrances/exits and to avoid possibility of contact with other year groups Y 4. Doors: Zone and classroom doors are open, so children and staff do not need to touch any doors 5. Movement: Movement at breaks and lunch is under clear direction from staff 6. Any messages from a given “classroom” are sent to the office via email and messages for technical support are sent to technicians@tdms. Technicians remote to support the staff/students as a matter of rule. 7. Toilet Protocol: Instructions are clear with one child goes to the toilet at one time from any given class within the year group (see earlier) 8. Face coverings: Students and staff are required to wear face masks in communal areas around the school 9. Staff collect children from zones to take to lessons to reduce congestion at any time. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Stationery: Children will bring their own stationery (pencil/ruler/sharpener/rubber) which they will keep and will not share with others 2. Students have paper to work on and stored in a folder, this is not shared between students or staff 3. Any worksheets will be placed on tables before entry of children into classroom. Worksheets will be retained in exercise books, not handed in 4. Use of resources are carefully monitored and controlled. Shared resources are cleaned before other students use them 5. Homework: Homework is via google classroom. In the event where physical work has to be handed in, it will be using the blue sheet system and will be left in a tray for 72 hours before the member of staff marks it and left before returning to the children 6. Water Bottles: Each child will bring two own named water bottle, which they will keep and refill from home 7. Doors: Doors are wedged open to minimise any touch points 8. Touch Points: All likely touch points cleaned every day 9. Cleaner schedule: There will be a designated cleaner for each zone with tables cleaned thoroughly every night 10. Lesson planning: Lessons will be planned so resources are individual and any sharing at all is minimised. There will be minimal distribution (preferably none) of any resources during a lesson 11. Hand sanitising: Children will use hand sanitiser before and after each double lesson

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1. Structured Reintegration: A carefully phased structured reintegration has been designed, to ensure the children are properly and sensitively able to adjust to returning to school under, what are, uniquely stressful circumstances
2. Welfare Team: Set up consisting of our DSL, the SITs and the school counsellor
3. Internal support: Support from the school counsellor or a member of the Safeguarding Team is available if required to enable a referral to counselling support
4. External support: A support network and resources will be signposted in safeguarding letter, before the summer holidays to provide support if necessary over the holidays
5. Close contact with parents will continue as required
6. Well-being and activities to alleviate anxiety, have been carried out as part of the curriculum to be delivered to support well-being
7. The level of need will be reviewed daily in the first week and then regularly after that point

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1. Communication during planning: There will be regular communication during the planning phase to ensure all staff feel that protective measures are in place. Staff received information so they knew exactly where each year groups arrives/leaves/evacuates/has break/lunch etc to reduce anxiety.
2. Staff walk through: Staff were able to have a short “walk through” of the zones by SLT on the CPD days and therefore receive a visual explanation of how the systems will be operating, so they will be fully clear and assured, well before the children arrive
3. Risk Assessment: RA will be shared, to enable input into hazard identification and control measures
4. Staff Training: Training will take place on student anxiety and the virus and staff will be advised to refer anxious children to the Welfare Team
5. SLT Support: Staff will be supported by SLT and provided with support from outside agencies if required
6. Staff Meetings: Are held virtually where adequate social distancing cannot be maintained
7. Staff will be clear that they have the right at any time to speak to the Head/member of SLT to highlight any concerns that they have
8. SLT Monitoring: SLT will be fully aware of all procedures in all zones and will also monitor specific year

- groups as the designated point of contact for staff to share any concerns
9. Risk Assessment will be reviewed on a regular basis
 10. Main Office: Office staff are able to be in as space is sufficient and there will be signs on door to ensure no other staff are permitted entry
 11. Photocopying: Photocopying requests will be emailed and the return process to be determined outside of normal school day
 12. Staff areas: Designated “staff areas” have been identified. Each member of staff has a designated “safe place”
 13. Classroom cleaning: Each classroom has designated cleaning equipment (foam/tissue/antibac wipes). Staff have received specific instruction regarding surfaces to be cleaned through either an antibac wipe or via a cloth that has been sprayed. There must be no direct spraying onto surfaces as this dislodges the virus.
 14. Classroom layouts have been adjusted to ensure that a 2m distance between staff and students can be maintained

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1. Volatile children: Any volatile children were identified in advance and supported with very clear expectations from the beginning
2. Response to any poor behaviour: Parents were made aware that any risky behaviour will mean their child will
3. Restraint: Staff were advised not to restrain except in absolute emergency, instead containment and de-escalation will be used
4. Prevention: Children showing any symptoms will be immediately isolated in school and cared for by one single adult (with PPE if unable to observe 2m social distance)
5. Resources: Extra disposable aprons and extra gloves are available
6. Quarantine: Is assured through the use of the first aid room (as it has adequate washing and toilet facilities) to ensure full social distancing for any minor or major first aid. PPE for staff member dealing (see point 4 above)
7. Social Distancing: Clear instruction given to all staff that they must retain social distancing from the children and each other
8. Staff Code of conduct: Updated and circulated to ensure all staff are fully aware of their responsibilities.

The risk assessment has been updated to take account of the new variant of COVID-19 and the arrangements in place for the national lockdown which started 5 January 2021. A collection of evidence suggest that the new variant has a significant, substantial increase in transmissibility. There is no evidence the new strain of the virus causes more serious illness in either children or adults and there continues to be strong evidence, to date, that children and younger people (those under 18 years old) are much less susceptible to severe clinical disease than older people.

During the period of national lockdown, schools, alternative provision, special schools, and colleges will remain open to vulnerable children and young people and the children of critical workers only. All other children and students will learn remotely until February half term. We have put the following in place:

- High-quality remote education has been provided for all students. Work is set via Google Classroom with narrated PowerPoints, virtual lessons (Y12 and 13 only), online tutorial (Year 11 only), work packs and textbooks (where appropriate)
- Weekly phone calls to check on students, for specific cases the frequency of the contact is increased
- Email support for students through email or the Google Classroom feedback system
- Vulnerable students and children of critical workers will be supervised in school to complete the work set by members of staff in Google Classroom

- Lunch service suspended. VCW groups to bring a packed lunch. Students entitled to Free School Meals have been sent food vouchers to support
- Staff to work from home wherever possible
- SEND students to receive support by the achievement assistants

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The majority of the students have been instructed to work from home apart from vulnerable students and children of critical workers. 2. Visitors are not encouraged to attend the school site, virtual meetings will be used whenever possible. If contractors need to visit the school, this will be encouraged when there are no students on site. If this is not possible visitors/contractors will be encouraged to maintain social distance from staff and students at the school 3. Staff have been placed on a rota in school to reduce the amount of time that they are required to attend. Staff will be advised that they should not come to the school site outside the times on the rota. 4. Support and office based staff in school will have access to their own dedicated area to ensure that social distancing can be maintained 5. Everyone will be asked not come into school if they or anyone that they are living with are experiencing symptoms for COVID-19 and to follow the national self-isolation guidelines. Regular reminders will be sent out. 6. If a symptomatic person comes into school they will be sent home immediately and asked to follow national guidance for self-isolating. If they cannot leave the school site immediately they will be isolated from other members of the school community until they can be collected. The area that the person has been will be deep cleaned and public health guidance will be taken on advice to other members of the school who may need to be advised to self-isolate 7. If a symptomatic person requires first aid: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. As much as possible a 2M distance will be maintained b. The member of staff supporting will wear appropriate PPE, including face mask, gloves, apron and eye protection c. Supporting members of staff will wash their hand for at least 20 seconds immediately after providing first aid 8. In the majority of cases Internal staff meetings are conducted virtually. If this is not possible all meetings will take place to allow social distancing to be maintained 9. Systematic testing of staff and students attending the school setting will be introduced following all government guidance
